Dear Friends at St. Veronica,

This Sunday, Mother's Day, our parish will be filled with excitement about mothers. What a joyful day to celebrate mothers! It's a day of gratitude! A day of love! A day of family! Hopefully, it's also a day of rejoicing and jokes! Here is something funny I want to share with you about "Things Only a Mother can Teach."

- 1. My Mother taught me about **ANTICIPATION**... "Just wait until your father gets home."
- 2. My Mother taught me about **RECEIVING**.... "You are going to get it when we get home!"
- 3. My Mother taught me to **MEET A CHALLENGE**... "What were you thinking? Answer me when I talk to you! Don't talk back to me!"
- 4. My Mother taught me **LOGIC**...
 "If you fall out off that swing and break your neck, you're not going to the store with me."
- 5. My Mother taught me **MEDICAL SCIENCE**... "If you don't stop crossing your eyes, they are going to freeze that way."
- 6. My Mother taught me to **THINK AHEAD**...
 "If you don't pass your spelling test, you'll never get a good job."
- 7. My Mother taught me **HUMOR**...
 "When that lawn mower cuts off your toes, don't come running to me."
- 8. My Mother taught me how to **BECOME AN ADULT**... "If you don't eat your vegetables, you'll never grow up."

This Mother's Day, I want to reflect with you on three things:

- 1. Let us thank our Mothers. Mothers are as close as we can get to the deepest springs of life. Without mothers, we could never have seen the light of day. From the moment of our conception, we couldn't have been closer to anyone else. They taught us---still teach us---about life, love, faith, family, forgiveness, and beauty. They taught us about what it means to be human, how to face the world, how to cope with suffering, how to deal with failure, how to be magnanimous in success, how to be humble, and how to fulfill our destiny.
- **2.** Let's see God's presence in our Mothers. There is a Chinese proverb that says, "God couldn't be present everywhere; so he made mothers." How true! If human beings can become living sacraments of God's presence, our mothers excel in the art of revealing God's love and grace for us in unparalleled ways. For us Catholics, with our deep love for the Eucharist, mothers can be celebrated as our "first Eucharist's" because when we were still in their womb, our mothers in effect told us to eat their flesh and drink their blood. We fed on our mothers and became viable human beings, capable of coming into the world and finding our own place in this vast universe. Thanks to our mothers---our first Eucharist's---we understand the profound meaning of how Jesus becomes our Eucharist. They help us understand and appreciate the self-giving love of Jesus. They, in fact, lead us closer to Jesus, who calls us to share ourselves selflessly with others, especially with those who are in need.
- 3. Let's love and serve our Mothers. Today is the day to really ask these questions: How do I show gratitude to my mother? How do I love her? How do I take care of her? Love consists not in words, but in deeds. Do we spend time with our mothers? Do we give them a call? Do we visit them regularly? Are we patient and loving toward them? When they are ill and fragile, do we take them under our wings of love and care? For everything our mothers have done for us, a lifetime wouldn't be enough to show gratitude. If our mothers have gone home to the Lord, let us ask them to intercede for us with God. They are powerful advocates for us as they are close to God and His son our Lord Jesus Christ.

Life & Dignity Sunday - May 8 & 9, 2010

The bishops of California have established the Catholic Legislative Network (CLN) to develop a strong, clear, moral voice for life and justice in our state during a very difficult time. Next weekend during *Life & Dignity Sunday*, all parishioners will have an opportunity to register for the Network. Following is a description of the newly created advocacy network. Come prepared next week to register for this important new effort.

The Catholic Legislative Network (CLN)

Our Catholic faith calls us to participate in the life of our communities. From conception to natural death, our faith calls us to protect life and to promote dignity and respect for all human beings. In their 2008 *Faithful Citizenship* statement, the U.S. Bishops write these challenging words. "In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue; participation in the political process is a moral obligation." (Page 4, par. 13)

In response to this challenge, the bishops of California have established a state-wide legislative network of Catholics who are being asked to become more engaged in the political process. On the weekend of May 15 & 16, 2010 every parish in the Archdiocese of San Francisco will hold a *Life & Dignity Sunday*. During each Mass, the Network will be explained and parishioners will be encouraged to register for the Network. Completed registration cards will be forwarded to the California Catholic Conference for inclusion in the statewide data base. Our bishop will ensure that this network is only used for public policy.

The Catholic Legislative Network is an organizational vehicle that will enable members to become well informed and to act on important issues in our state. Through a brief, weekly e-newsletter called *Public Policy Insights*, network members will learn about issues and actions being taken on certain priority issues. In addition, periodic Action Alerts will be sent to members asking them to send an e-mail, a letter, or to make a phone call to their Senator or Assembly member. If a Senator receives 10 E-mail messages on an issue, he/she probably pays little attention. If that same senator receives 1000 messages, he/she may decide to pay attention. A strong *voice for life and dignity* can make the difference.

There could not be a more important time for this network to emerge. California is in crisis morally and economically. Staggering budget deficits have shredded the safety net that once protected vulnerable children and aging adults. But while funding for life-giving programs is eliminated, financial resources for abortion clinics have not been similarly reduced, and each year proposals to allow doctors to assist their patients in committing suicide gain momentum in the legislature. The state is also struggling to decide what a marriage looks like. As Catholics we care deeply about all these "life and dignity" issues. The state needs a strong, clear, moral voice for life and dignity now!
